Are You Ready to be a CPC?

Basic Steps to Implement CPC P-3

1. Review CPC-P3 Requirements (by each element) and identify areas that are either 'met' or 'not met'.

Physical infrastructure

- 1. Identify Parent Resource Room (physical space for parent involvement activities)
- 2. Review existing processes that promote continuity of programming across P through 3rd grade. If undeveloped, identify leadership team members
 - a. For independent PK sites, identify elementary sites for continuity of CPC P3 services and programming
 - b. For P-3 schools, identify current P-3 strategies (communication, professional development, curricula, collaboration, parent involvement).

Staffing

- 1. Identify (recruit, hire) CPC P3 team members, including:
 - Parent Resource Teacher (PRT)
 - School-Community Representative (SCR)
 - Parent Involvement Liaison
 - Head Teacher
 - Curriculum Alignment Liaison
 - Grade-level teachers and/ or support staff
- 2. Identify instructional coach to deliver online PD content and follow-up activities
- 3. Examine student/ teacher ratios and if needed, hire required additional staff as necessary to meet 17:2 (PK)/ 25:2 (K-3) ratios.

Funding

- 1. Examine student/ teacher ratios and if needed, identify funding sources to meet the 17:2 (PK)/ 25:2 (K-3) ratios.
- 2. Identify funding sources for additional needed Leadership Team personnel

Planning for implementation

- 1. Set professional development dates for PK (or all teaching teams for calendar year.
- 2. Set monthly: 1) grade- level, 2) joint grade, and 3) across school meetings for calendar year
